

## LINDAB'S ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CARRIERS

One of the Lindab Group's largest sources of emissions is transportation. We want to collaborate with suppliers to find solutions with focus on reducing the environmental impact. By 2040 Lindab Group will only use 100% renewable fuel or electrical vehicles.

These requirements are a complement to the Lindab Supplier Principles.

### Lindab Group requires:

- Certification for ISO 14001. If not, an established environmental management system is required.
- Only vehicles that comply with at least Euro class 5 should be used. If not, a plan for implementation of new trucks is required.
- New purchased trucks must follow the two latest Euro classifications or be powered by electricity or renewable fuel.
- Tyres with an Energy Label and instructions for ensuring correct air pressure.
- Trucks to be equipped with catalytic converters and particle filters.
- Correct vehicle capacity for the assignment being carried out, e.g., engine power, size, and equipment, to avoid overcapacity.
- Education of drivers for eco-driving, and that all drivers follow the driving techniques and receive coaching regarding eco-driving at least yearly.
- Active work on traffic level to reduce empty runs and increase loading efficiency.
- Active work to increase the share of environmentally friendly trucks among the truck fleet, e.g., implementation of biofuel, electric-vehicles, or similar.
- The carrier shall twice per year, in January and August, provide to Lindab the following data:
  - Transported weight per shipment
  - Driven kilometers per shipment
  - Vehicles information, including type of vehicles, fuel, euro class, tyres, equipment, catalytic converters, and particle filters, and
  - Other information requested by Lindab.

Upon the request by Lindab the Carrier must be able to present how they work to follow the requirements set out in this document. The procedure follows Lindab's method for evaluating suppliers, where the supplier is asked to share information about its operations and plans to reduce environmental impact in a self-assessment questionnaire.
